Cole Taylor needed to find a mover with the experience and size necessary to be able to handle the relocation of four widely separated locations into one new building.



The Cole Taylor Building

Cole Taylor Bank recently consolidated corporate offices from four city and suburban locations into their new building in northwest suburban Rosemont. Coincidentally, Boyer-Rosene also move US Bank into their regional headquarters right across the street! The building's builder McShane also chose Boyer to relocate their offices into the building when it opened.

Boyer-Rosene's project team worked closely with bank personnel and consultants to plan and coordinate the timing of the arrival of furnishings and contents from the four regional facilities into the new building. This required a large staff of movers, trucks, and equipment working in synchro-



nization at multiple facilities. Some of the facilities had been occupied by the bank for decades. A significant amount of purging reduced the quantity of items to move. A carefully executed crate recycling program was instituted with Rentacrate to also help keep the overall cost of the relocation as low as possible, enabling Cole Taylor to take advantage of lower unit costs by using fewer crates for a longer period and recycling them instead of incurring additional rental, pick up, and delivery costs. This move also required redundant operations to be set up at both the old and new facilities so that the banks branches and customers were never inconvenienced by the move. Additionally several unique, large pieces of check sorting equipment were decommissioned, transported, and reinstalled.
